SOPHOMORE SPEAKERS PREPARE FOR CONTEST

Names of Volunteers Must Be in Hands of Professor Gates by Tomorrow Noon

Subjects for the preliminary talks in the Sophomore Speaking Contest will be distributed among the second-year contestants in Room 14 Old Main at ten-thirty o'clock on the afternoon of Tuesday, December ninth. Speakers will be given slightly more than two hours in which to prepare their extemporaneous speeches for delivery the next evening in the Auditorium at seven o'clock.

Volunteer speakers from the schools of Mines and Natural Science are requested to hand their names to Professor T. J. Gates of the English Department in Room 30 Old Main at five o'clock tomorrow noon. All volunteers must be sophomore or not taking Agriculture and Dairy. This contest is not extended to men in these schools until their junior year, but it has been decided that sophomores not taking English IV will be allowed the privilege of entering the contest.

Practically all of the thirty-four sections in English IV have elected representatives to enter the preliminary round together with volunteers. The English Department expects to have at least fifty men contesting for the prizes.

Two awards are to be offered, the college prize of fifty dollars to the winner and the twenty-five dollar award of the Forensic Council to the runner-up. The prize money will be distributed at the closing of the contest.
