Navy Contest


Leaving Lehigh's eight o'clock Friday morning the Blue and White hosts reached Allentown in the afternoon in the afternoon rain. It was falling when the team arrived and following a short rest the players took the field for a little hours' work in passing and playing the ball.

Starting the first score went to be pipped by the new stadium. Navy opened the play of the second quarter with a rough and vicious attack. The leadership used a combination and dangerous method of attack and in the time the visitors resembled a torrent from the narrow players were swept from their feet to a shoo while by this unscrupulous tactics but the Penn morale soon rallied and in no time were its opponents allowed to come closer than the twelve yard mark.
