**WORKOUTS BEGIN FOR FRESHMEN GRAPPLERS**

**Coch Davidson Grooms Yearlings For Tilt with Lehigh on March Fourteenth**

The Penn State wrestling wrestling season began this week in preparation for their proposed schedule of three or four matches. To date Lehigh has been signed up, and it is probable that the Lion cubs will meet the Brown and White freshmen grapplers about March fourteenth. It is hoped that other matches may be obtained with the Hollidaysburg and Lewisburg Y M C A teams and with the Penn freshmen.

Practice has been going forward under the watchful eye of Coach J. A. Davidson '23, and already some promising material has shown up in the group of wrestling candidates. An unusually large number of men answered the call issued before Christmas a cut in the squad became necessary. The remaining group with which Coach Davidson is working at present consists of about thirty freshmen.

The work to date has been of a conditioning nature accompanied by practice on fundamental holds. About five of the letter have been taught from the standing position and seven from the mat. The weights, ropes and bouli track hold prominent places on the wrestling program, and it is planned to have the cubs in the pink of condition before they enter their final contest.

In accordance with a statement that prospects are far for a good wrestling season at Penn State Coach Davidson has been directing the Nittany grapplers in strenuous work-outs during the past week. Although a number of candidates were not present on the opening day of practice they have since come out and work is now going forward steadily.

A major part of the time is being given now to the mastery of new holds with accompanying training to get the men back into condition after the recent vacation period. The style of the Nittany offense this year will be much the same as that used by Coach Davidson last season except that the men will be required to learn more holds. This system will also place great emphasis on obtaining falls, and should have the Penn State win some decisive victories if successfully carried out.
