Student Committee and Members of Faculty Consider Revised June Program

With the purpose of providing a Commencement Week program suitable to both college authorities and student body, a committee headed by W. G. Wickard '25, representing the Student Council and the Intercollegiate and Inter-Medical Council met Saturday afternoon with E. N. Sullivan, Alumni Secretary, and Hummel '25, Assistant to the Dean of Men, to consider a proposed program. Previous to the holiday season the three councils had presented a petition to the Senate requesting that Senior Week be abolished and that the usual house party plans be carried out this year. The petition was not approved and a Senate committee headed by Dean Waincock drew up a program for the June activities and submitted it to the committee representing the three councils.
