

LORADO TAFT IS "Y" ENTERTAINER

Prominent Sculptor Gives Views on Plastic Art and Explains Methods Employed

TALK ILLUSTRATED BY ACTUAL CLAY MODELS

Presenting his subject in an unselfish manner, Lorado Taft, prominent sculptor with his keen humor and pleasant personality delighted the audience which attended the fourth number of the "Y" entertainers' series in the Auditorium Saturday evening.

His noted artistic ideal of sculpture is an ancient and venerable art illustrating how this subject has always been an expression of ideals. Color does not enter in this art but form is the basis of it all.

Mr. Taft then dwelt on the human head with its remarkable strength and grace. For this purpose he brought forth models of the skull and face which were placed in his stage studio. He described the outline of expression and told how our every thought and deed helped to form the lines and shape of our visage.

The process of sculpture was the next division of his lecture. At this time the materials were described and the simple tools that they are required. Mr. Taft then told a few fundamental rules for modeling and showed how the experienced artist gets the size and details into his work and leaves out the superfluous ones.

Thinking the head of the Princess in Lorraine to illustrate his talk the artist then changed the visage from youth to old age. By slight dexterous touches he made the model frown and describe all the changes that age actually brings to even the most beautiful face.

The method used in plaster casting was next taken up by Mr. Taft. This step was omitted from the making of the clay figure to the final removal of the plaster cast from the finished
