LION TRACKMEN READY FOR INDOOR CONTEST

Clipp was entered last year in the high event in the Allstate games and broke a long-standing record for the distance capturing his best in 6 and 1-2 seconds.

In the finals Moore was defeated by Carl Anderson of the Allstate track club who equaled Clipp's time and now jointly holds the new record which he and White captain. Although Anderson has retired from active competition, Clipp will run against other hurdlers who are veterans of Olympic games and will receive much trouble from this quarter.

Both Reilly of the I. A. C. and Christensen of Sweden were Olympic competitors at the games last year and besides these men Clipp will also be pitted against Meyers of the New York A. C. and Sullivan from Boston College. Meyers and Reilly will both run against Captain Moore in the low hurdles and Osborn another Olympic and I. A. C. star in the 100 yard sprint.

Opposition is expected from "Red" Bowman of Syracuse sprint star of the 1924 United States Olympic team. Bowman primarily a sprinter by virtue of his success in the shorter events will compete only in the low hurdles since his stride is not adapted to leaping over the raised bars. According to "Red" Moore is of the speed known as "Chicago" style and is expected to conclude a bid of five yards to Bowman before the first hurdle is topped.

CHANGES ARE MADE IN WRESTLING RULES

lock hold is barred while contestants are on the mat which is stalling. This rule does not apply to contestants while they are on their feet.

5 Between the first nine minutes and the first extra period on minutes rest will be given to the contestants remaining on the mat and they shall receive no outside attention whatsoever.

6 All time advantage gained in nine minutes will be discarded in the extra three minute periods.

7 In all cases if a contestant is injured, and if by a physician's sanction the contestant is able to continue, three minutes shall be given from time of injury for the injured contestant to rest. In case of man not being able to continue the bout be awarded a default.

Time of Bout
Unlike the bouts of last year which continued for ten minutes, bouts this season will run for nine minutes. The time formerly allotted to wrestling hours in the case of a draw at the end of the nine minutes two extra periods of three minutes each will be added. Using the referee's hold on the mat, one contestant will be allowed on top at the beginning of the first period while the alternate contestant will start on top at the opening of the second extra period.

Another change in the rules used during the past season prevents the interlocking of the fingers in the wrist lock hold. The man obtaining the hold may keep one hand in the other or may keep his wrist to maintain the hold but his fingers must be visible at all times or the hold will be barred.

Black Surprises
Although reputed to be considerably slower than last year, BHP Black took the initiative in the 115 pound bout and tripping his man to the mat, the Blue and White matman secured his fall in 2 minutes and 7 seconds. Manning a newcomer on the Penn State varsity gave an excellent account of himself in the 158 pound weight against Tard of Muhlenberg. Holding himself steady in the face of tugging tactics on the part of the Matson grappler, Manning found his hold after practically two minutes of sparring and threw his man in 3 minutes and 24 seconds.

in the shortest bout of the meet, 1 minute and 1 second actual time. Tapping his man to the mat by the shoulders after a few seconds, Rumbough rolled him to his back and obtained a takedown soon after with a Nelson and body lock.

Starting from the bell, the men soon went to the mat, where the inexperience of the Nittany grappler was evident for a time. Keeping his elbows high while in a roll Prevost was carried under and narrowly escaped going into the hold of the Muhlenberg leader. After reclaiming the top, however, the Nittany contestant took the initiative, throwing his man in the good time of 4 minutes and 7 seconds.
