good race and hand a lead of at least a few yards to K. H. Barley '26, the anchor man stepping the mile.


Helfrich and Moore Run

Helfrich holds the world's record for this distance over an indoor track, and is in a fair way to approach his best time against this keen competition.

Fletcher representing Harvard, Scrogood, of Princeton and Wolff of the University of Pennsylvania, all fast men line up with the Nittany leader, as also do Herb Meyers of Newark, and Farrell and Christenson of the same club.


