

JUNE EXAMINATION SCHEDULE IS ANNOUNCED BY REGISTRAR

All registrations and payments for the second semester will end Saturday June 20, 1925, at noon. There will be no scheduled examinations for seniors or those graduating in June. Examinations for juniors, sophomores and freshmen will take place from June eighth to June twelfth, inclusive.

NO CONFLICTS WILL BE ARRANGED AFTER APRIL NINTH. Any student having two examinations scheduled at the same time, or any student having three examinations scheduled on the same day, is required to report the fact in person at the Registrar's Office on the special form provided there. To receive adjustment, such conflicts MUST be reported not later than five o'clock on Thursday, April ninth.

Notices of adjustments will be mailed to students and to the heads of departments on May second, 1925.

Appointment examinations should not be arranged until after notices of adjustments have been sent out. The dates of these examinations will be announced during the week of May eighteenth, by the instructors concerned.

Examinations will be of two hours duration, beginning at eight and ten o'clock a. m. and two o'clock p. m.
