The Penn State representatives in the mile, Barclay, Fitzpatrick, Stewart, Fournace and O. Smith, should take the majority of places in that distance.

In the hurdles Coach Cartmell will probably enter Captain Crisp Moore, Leach and Costello. All three men did well in the Bucknell meet and should pile up many points in both the barrier events. The competition in the two-mile promises to be keen, as in Times and Gottlieb, Coach Keane has two good runners. The Nittany entries in this field are Barclay, Fournace and Johnson.

which shall be published in the COLLEGIAN, sent to every fraternity at Penn State and to the national chapter of the guilty fraternity.  
Second offense—The guilty fraternity shall be dropped from this council for six months and notice of such action shall be sent to all fraternities at Penn State, to the national fraternity of the offending fraternity and published in the COLLEGIAN.  
14. A fraternity will be held responsible for the acts of its alumni as well as for the acts of its active members.

Each of this report were given to each of the fraternities represented at the meeting. Action will be taken by the individual chapters and at the next meeting of the council the set of rules and regulations will be discussed for approval.
