DISTRIBUTION OF TREES OVER UNSHADED FIELDS PLANNED BY FORESTERS

Undertaken by many faithful attempts to encourage the planting of forest trees on idle lands about State College the Forestry department has evolved an entirely new plan for spreading seedlings over the unshaded fields. Up to this time every attempt to reforest flat lands has been blocked by the owners of the ground who could not see the great benefits of such an undertaking.

The present purpose of the Forestry department is to have the trees distributed free of charge and to divide the work among forestry students. This plan has been put into effect by a small staff planting quite successful. The grounds of several local residents have been benefited in this manner, while one thousand seedlings used will save some fifty feet of valuable timber.

The Forestry department realizes the rapid depletion of forest trees and in an attempt to do all in its power to remedy this fact it has set on foot the complete reforesting of every idle spot in or around State College.

Class Dues
 After an extensive survey of class budgets for several years the committee of half could be effected through a per capita assessment of dues which would be paid as part of the semester fees. Exact figures show that whereas the present system, his total outlay would be according to the proposed measure twenty-five and one-half dollars.

Thanks for the Sophomore Hop and Junior Prom are included in this outline but the chief objection lay in the extraordinary cost which would cause these two functions. The Council accepted President Thomas' recommendation that parking in front of the Allen street entrance to the College be prohibited despite the fact that Superintendent Webber did the presence of the cars prevented tourists from crashing into the chimneys as has happened in the past.
