Neale, a steel built back, five feet four and a good punter, is Dutch choice for the first team quarter-back berth, while Wolf is ending the search for the scrub team. Both men are fast, and are skilled at throwing passes. Neale has the advantage of more experience while Wolf is the larger man of the two.

Hamas, the former East Brothersford half, and Wilson are joint contenders of the half-back positions. Both men are six feet in height, fairly heavy and promise to be good ground-gainers. Monahan and Synness are the two other backs whose work has been of high calibre.

For the fullback berth the competition narrows down to Whitmore and Buchanan. The former is now holding the coveted position on the first team and with his weight and height, should prove a formidable back.
