

PENN STATE AG SCHOOL ENROLLS SIX HUNDRED

Nittany Institution Expected To Retain Its Rank as Fourth Largest in Country

With its 600 student enrollments the agricultural school at the Pennsylvania State College this year is expected to retain its ranking as the fourth largest of its kind in the United States.

Registrar's figures today showed a total student enrollment of 3552, including 213 special, graduate and two-year students.

The School of Engineering once more reflects the leading demand for Penn State courses, it having a capacity enrollment of 1100 four-year students.

PROF. HOTCHKISS TO GO TO PURDUE UNIVERSITY

Professor C. H. Hotchkiss '18 of the Department of Mechanical Engineering left on Monday of this week to take up his duties as Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering at Purdue University.

Professor Hotchkiss was graduated from Penn State in 1918 in the course in Industrial Engineering and received the degree of M. E. in 1921.
