

P. J. KAPO '26 WINS MEDICAL SCHOLARSHIP

Successful in a competitive examination, P. J. Kapo '26, who completed his pre-medical studies here last year, was the winner of a scholarship which offers free tuition for four years in the school of medicine at the University of Pennsylvania.

This scholarship was earned by a series of competitive examinations in English, German, Latin, chemistry and biology and is awarded to the three contestants receiving the highest grades. Kapo ranked first in scholarship among the pre-medical students of his class and was also president of the Pre-medical Society here last year.

(Continued from first page) He also secured for Mr. Bauer a position which consisted of playing sonatas twice a week with an old Polish aristocrat who had escaped from his native country during the insurrection. During this period, Bauer's services were in great demand. He later toured eastern Europe with a concert and was hailed as a genius at every performance.

In Constantinople he played a concert alone. It was so successful that he was the recipient of numerous requests to return to Paris and to arrange contracts with the great opera houses there. He returned to his "chosen city" and made frequent appearances. His popularity as a great pianist increased with tremendous strides and his reputation was soon permanently established.

Mr. Bauer has played in America for ten successive seasons. Last year he moved his permanent home to New York and applied for American citizenship.

His concert tomorrow will start at eight-fifteen o'clock. Tickets will be

on sale at the "Y" Hut tomorrow morning and admission will be one dollar and fifty cents. Course tickets are on sale now. They are priced from three to five dollars and entitle the holder to admission to the entire seven events which constitute the season's entertainment.
