down on the Omoans' thirty-yard marker.  
At this point a pass, gathered in superbly by Hayes, substitute for Slamp, took the ball to a point about eleven yards from the final line. Roepke and Helbig carried the ball past the five-yard marker and on the next attempt Pritchard went over for the touchdown. Weston added the extra point.  
Although Ward, quarterback of the Marietta team, several times broke through the Nittany forwards to bring the Blue and White backs to earth, the line play of the Penn State aggregation was above the standard set in previous encounters. The line charged low, driving the Marietta defense before it, while when on the defense, the Nittany linemen plowed through the pluck, but small Ohio line to make tackle after tackle behind the point of scrimmage.  
It was mainly through heady play on the part of the forwards that Michaelske talked the first touchdown. Bucking the line consistently after Lungren had snared a Marietta punt on the visitors' thirty-yard line, Michaelske and Lungren carried the brunt of the attack, and Michaelske was not called upon to advance the oval until the ball was but three yards from the goal line. The opposing line was worn out and Michaelske literally walked through the Marietta team for the score.

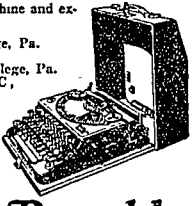
