 expected. They carry with them a bag of tricks; the triple pass, the fake kick, the lateral pass and the "Statue of Liberty" fake pass, one of the oldest tricks in the autumn game and one of the most successful. The Michigan State squad emphasizes the captains of four sports—football, baseball, basketball and track. Haskins, gridiron leader, is a natural football player, being at home either at end or tackle on the backfield. Hackett, baseball captain, is a regular at right guard. Kiebler, head of the basketball quintet, is first substitute halfback, while Grim, track captain, divides the work of right end with Drew.

Varsity Shows Strength
 In the daily practice game against the freshmen Wednesday, two touchdowns was the margin by which the Varsity attained supremacy. A diving and passing attack by the varsities took the oval within the Varsity's twenty-yard line where Whitmore fumbled. Slamp recovered and raced the remaining distance to tally a six-pointer for the ultimate winners.

over the line for the final score gave the daily game to the Varsity.
 Following the freshman scrimmage, the "Wildcats" gave the first team a long and intensive drill using Michigan Aggie plays. The triple pass failed to gain consistently and the "Statue of Liberty" was moved backward. Even though the Varsity showed its ability to cope with the visitors' plays, it still has to encounter the fleet backs and ends of the Aggies and it is the speed of the opponents which will be the deciding factor in tomorrow's game.

Nittany Lineup
 The tried and true captain of the Lion gridlers, Basil Gray, twice leader of Penn State's football hopes, returns to his former position as snapper-back, Mahoney taking the corresponding berth on the second team.

McGinn is in the vacancy at left tackle and has pulled up to the Varsity by means of two weeks of con-

sistent work with the scrubs. House and Pilak remain at guards, and Hastings at right tackle. At the terminals, Slamp is a certainty at the left wing, but the right side of the line is not sure. Either Weston or Wilson will start, with the former paying the call over his teammate. Pincera is retained at quarterback with Dangerfield and Pritchard at the halfback positions and Michalske at fullback.

With another backfield in reserve and a second line of good quality, Bezdek is well-fortified for the fray. Helbig calls signals for the second set of backs, Langren playing the left half, Rookpe right half and Bergman fullback. McPhee and Hayes at ends, Hartman, Fellows, Munn and Schmirky in the line and Mahoney at center make up the forwards.

Aggie Lineup
 Captain Haskins will probably start at left end for the invading eleven, with either Grim or Drew at the other terminal. Hummel has been assigned to the left tackle berth and Spierman will take that place on the other side of the line. Gaver at left guard, Vogel at center and Hackett at the remaining position, complete the line.

Lyman will direct the team from quarterback, Ruhl and McCosh playing the halves and Boehringer fullback. McCosh is noted for the splendid execution of his punts, while Boehringer is a triple threat man who can plunge, run the ends and pass equally well.

 take place Saturday noon, when graduates of Michigan State will hold a luncheon in his honor. Graduates of Massachusetts Agricultural college will be his hosts on Saturday evening when they convene at the home of Dr. S. W. Fletcher.

Born in Lapeer, Michigan, in 1868, Dr. Butterfield received his bachelor's degree from the Michigan Agricultural college in 1891. He was later a graduate student at the University of Michigan and received his master's degree in 1902. He was further honored with a doctor's degree at Amherst college in 1910.

Holds Many Offices
 From 1891 to 1892 he was assistant secretary of the Michigan Agricultural college and while there, was editor of the "Michigan Grange Visitor." He became an instructor in rural sociology in 1896 at the University of Michigan and following this line of work, became president and professor of political economy at the Rhode Island College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts. In 1903 he was appointed to the presidency of the

Massachusetts Agricultural college. President Butterfield has been chairman of several important committees, the most important of which were the committee on world co-operation in agriculture and the commission on agricultural credit. Well versed in his subject, he is the author of several important books, "The Country Church," "The Rural Problems" and "The Farmer and the New Day" are several of his well-known works.


