

**"THE SEVENTH GUEST" IS NEXT PLAYER ATTEMPT**

**Plot Proclaimed by Theatrical Critics—D. D. Mason Names Tentative Selections**

Forgetting for the time being the lighter themes of their former productions, the Penn State Players are now concentrating their efforts on "The Seventh Guest," a play which should thrill any audience because of its deep mystery plot.

Last year this play was given in the city of Chicago and met with immediate success, being proclaimed as one of the best by theatrical critics. This will be the first performance in this section of the county as the Players are the first company to signify their intention of staging this weird combination of mystery and intrigue.

**Tentative Cast**  
In an attempt to get an idea as to the material with which he has to work, D. D. Mason held tryouts last week and has named a tentative cast for the performance. The selections are not final however, and may be changed at any time.

Because of her successful work last year in "The Rescue," "The First Year" and "Children of the Moon" Miss M. D. Reed '28 will play the leading female role, taking the part of Marilyn Henick. Vivian will be played by Miss Dorothy Mueser '27 who also had parts last year in "The Children of the Moon," "Captain Applejack," "The Whole Town's Talking" and numerous other one-act plays. H. W. Cohen '28 will assume the role of Deegan, a comedy officer of the air patrol. The above named three characters have been definitely decided upon.

Arrangements have been made by Professor Mason for the showing of "Charley's Aunt" in Canton, Ohio and "Towanda" sometime in the early part of next semester. It is thought that the play will be given in February but no definite date has been decided upon for the performances. Three new characters will be seen in the cast of the away-from-home productions. Charley will be played by W. W. Kelley '28, Miss Ora Keefer '26 will take the part of Ella and Miss Bertha Krause '27 will interpret the role of Dona Luena.

**CO-ED RIFLE TEAM FIRES FIRST INTER-COLLEGIATE ENGAGEMENT TOMORROW**

The women's rifle team of the University of Washington and Penn State's co-ed sharpshooters will contest in the first intercollegiate match tomorrow. Matches this season with about seven other colleges and universities will follow. Chief among these are the University of Michigan, George Washington University, the University of Oklahoma and Cornell University.

Captain, Miss E. A. Bullock '27, manager, Miss L. E. Anderson '27, Miss M. H. Newell '28, Miss Katherine Holbrook '28 and Miss Harriet Butcher '28 are the first women rifles of Penn State. Regular practice for women was conducted by Lieutenant Guber of the military department in 1921, but no attempt was made to organize a team in that year. Last spring, however, practice was held under the instructions of Lieutenant Miller and from the group of candidates the five girls were chosen to represent the team.
