Structure To House Basketball Floor and Amphitheatre—Will Seat 5000

Regarding the erection of the proposed Recreation building R. I. Webber, Supt. of Grounds and Buildings, gives out the following facts.

The seats will be built in the style of an amphitheatre providing accommodations for five thousand people. Comfort to the spectators has been insured in that each seatboard will be twelve inches in width with a drop of eighteen inches to an eighteen inch floor under foot.

This arrangement will eliminate the crowding and cramping which characterizes the present seating plan in the Armory.
