PENN STATE DELEGATES ATTEND BELL BANQUET
 The faculty of Penn State represented by Deans G. L. Wendt and C. J. Stoddart, Professors C. L. Kinsloe, J. O. Keller, A. J. Wood, C. W. Hasek, C. W. Besse, C. E. Govier and E. D. Walka, were guests of the Bell System at a dinner celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the birth of the telephone held at the Centre Hills Country Club Wednesday evening.
 Following the luncheon Mr. L. S. O'Rourke representing the Bell Telephone Laboratories told the interesting story of how on March 10th, 1876, just fifty years ago, in a dingy attic in Boston, Professor Bell sent the first spoken message over an electric circuit with the request to his assistant, "Mr. Watson, come here I want you."
