UNDEFEATED CHESS TEAM TOPPLED BY BUCKNELL

Musser, Nathenson Win as DeVore Draws—Adams, Leach, Plotts Humbled

Meeting defeat for the first time this season, the Penn State Chess Club lost to the Bucknell university team by a score of 3 1-2 to 2 1-2 in a match held here Saturday night. The club defeated Bucknell by the same score in a tilt held earlier in the year.

N. R. Adams '28, captain of the Penn State team, played the first board, R. S. Leach '26, the second; L. R. Plotts '27, the third; J. R. Musser '27, the fourth; L. E. Nathenson '29, the fifth, and N. B. DeVore '26, the sixth. Bucknell won the first three games, but the Penn State men defeated the Lewisburg collegians in the fourth and fifth. The sixth game was a draw.

The fifth and final match of the season will be held at home Saturday, May first with the Williamsport Chess club.

Underpaths and pick the best men for the places.

The best chances for Blue and White victories seem to be in the shuttle hurdle race on a 150 yard distance, and in the 1-mile and 4-mile relays. With Captain Moore and Eggers as the key men for the shuttle relay, the first of its kind ever held in the Red and Blue Relays, Penn State will be on even terms with Pennsylvania who has Wolf and Frank for its dependables. A field of eight strong teams has entered this race which is run in four 120 yard relays.

In the quarter-mile relay, the only event that Penn State will probably

complete in Friday, the team will be selected from Bartholomew, Birely, Filkins, Karbach, Kilmer, Mathias and Torrence. In all the races Penn State will be handicapped by the end positions it secured in Tuesday's drawings.

Iowa and Georgetown Excel

The 1-mile relay quartet, three of which will probably be the same men who won the freshman championship last year, faces two extraordinary combinations in Iowa and Georgetown. "Any other year but this," says Cattmell, "I would feel reasonably sure that our present 1-mile team would win, but this year we must face two truly remarkable opponents. Iowa's quartet, Beatty, Phelps, Roberts, and Cahel, have shattered all Conference marks, while Georgetown is represented by four runners who are at their peak form. Georgetown has beaten Iowa and the caliber of these teams may be seen easily. Maryland, too, has strong talent."

Distance Relays To Be Thrillers

The Lion mentor has shifted his combination in order to pick the latest runners. In all probability the mile team will be selected from Torrence, Karbach, Bartholomew, Filkins, Sands, C. E. Smith, Mullinger, Moore, Davis and Hanna. The 2-mile team will be selected from Barclay, Davis, Hanna, Stewart, C. E. Smith, Taylor, Kittle and Helfrich.

Against experienced runners from Syracuse, Cornell, Boston college, Georgetown, and other colleges, Nate will send in a formidable 4-mile team. The present outlook indicates that Barclay, Fournace and Stewart are sure of places with the choice for fourth man lying among Johnson, Helfrich, Reis, Brown and O. Smith.

In the special events Nate has entered Birely, Torrence, Filkins, and Bartholomew in the 100-yard dash; Mathias, Bates and Birely in the broad jump; Bates and Sullivan in the high jump; Michalske in the discus; Ide and Reed in the hammer throw; Ammerman and Roberts in the javelin throw; and Mathias and Bates in the hop, skip and jump. These selections are indefinite for Nate will cut the list the early part of next week.
