Leonard wished to withhold several plans of attack that will be used against Syracuse university tomorrow the Lions will loose these plays on the St. Stephens stickmen. Although the maneuvers require elaborate stick-work in passing and shooting the Blue and White attacks hope to use them tomorrow to break through the defense of the visitors. That the St. Stephens combination will offer keen opposition is shown by the fact that it vanquished the invading Oxford-Cambridge lacrosse team 6-1 last week. The caliber of the New Yorkers' attack was evidenced when they scored two goals during the extra ten-minute period necessary after the count was tied 1-1 at the end of the regulation time. The early games on the opponents' schedule this season were cancelled because the school was quarantined on account of an epidemic of typhoid fever in the student body.

The probable lineup for St. Stephens is Uquihant at goal, Kroll at point and Viecland at cover point. Contall, Stevens and Harding will cavort at the defense positions while Stolp will hold down the center post. Patterson, Weeks and Millman on the offense, Rogan at out home and Wilson in home complete the twelve. The outstanding men in this combination are Weeks, Rogan, Wilson, Stolp and Harding, the later scoring two Lilies against the Oxford-Cambridge aggregation.

It is possible that Coach Leonard will alter the lineup used thus far this season by shifting Wendel to inhome and substituting Gersewitz at second attack for Bready. The remainder of the Penn State team will lineup with Harkins guiding the

Miss Baker, it will be remembered, was the adventuress in the "Pot-Boiler" and is cast in "You and I" as a parlor maid with social ambitions.


