Howman of Syracuse, Frank Hussey, Boston college's sensational 100-yard National champion, Henry Russell, Cornell's flashing sprinter, defending 220-yard champion, and the mighty Miller of Harvard.

After the trials in the hundred the heats for the half-mile begin. Penn State with Davis and Taylor bearing its colors, can not come up to the pace of four men who are capable of running better than 1:54 barring upsets. These are Richardson of Southern California, Watters of Harvard, winner of the title in 1921, Leness, Massachusetts Tech, and Campbell of Columbia.

Hogan of Yale, Boyden of California, Sobel of C C N Y, and Martin of Dartmouth, not to mention Niersbach of Southern California, who has been a finalist for the past two years, all possess unusual speed and Ted Meredith's 1:53 record set ten years ago is in danger of falling.

Event number three is the 120-yard high hurdles in which the numbers will be pared down to make possible the running of only two heats Saturday.

day to determine the championship. Following the high sticks comes the trials for the quarter mile. In this event the field will be cut down to nine men who, on the following day, will fight it out for the double four-long title.

Nate Cartmell has spent the last few days in concentrating on his quarter-milers. Kautbach, Sands and Torrence have turned in excellent times this week but will have to do better than 50 seconds to place. Both Paulsen of Yale and Miller of Stanford recently ran the distance in 48.8, less than a second slower than Tierney's winning time. Kane, Harvard star, is another favorite.

In the field events, trials are scheduled for tomorrow afternoon in all the events listed on the program. By a series of eliminations six men will be chosen to compete in the finals tomorrow. Penn State's lone chance in the weights, is in the hammer throw. Ide has been doing good work all season and should throw the iron ball 150 feet.

Unless upsets crowd out the Nittany runners, Nate's men should score in eight and possibly nine events. Barclay, runner up to Tibbetts of Harvard last year, should score a high place in the two-mile grind, although Loucks of Syracuse will press him, while Stewart and Fouracre should both be among the five leaders in the mile.

Bartholomew, facing his first intercollegiate test can be expected to give a good account of himself. Mathias and Bates should score in the broad jump and Moore in both hurdles. Ide should place with the hammer.
