

Registrar Announces Matriculation Method For Monday, Tuesday

To facilitate the registration of nearly four thousand students Monday and Tuesday of next week three steps have been outlined by Registrar W. S. Hoffman. Although new equipment and increased force will be on hand the Registrar desires the students to cooperate in writing clearly and completely.

The steps in registration will be as follows: First, A daily schedule should be prepared at the office of your scheduling officer. Freshmen may learn their officers from the back of their admission cards. Second, This schedule should be approved by the scheduling officer and then taken to the Registrar in the Armory, where a large blank form will be prepared. The Registrar will inspect schedules and forms retaining both.
