

## AG EXPERTS WILL HOLD POTATO DAY

Observance Set for October Thirteenth—To Discuss Harvest Methods

Penn State agriculturists, surrounding farming experts and visiting convention men will assemble here in celebration of Potato Day, October thirteenth. The American Society of Agricultural Engineers, having the last day of its convention coincident with the opening of the vegetable gala, will participate in the proposed ceremonies.

Several methods of potato harvesting, employed in different sections of the country will be demonstrated, compared and the superior method ascertained. An effort is being made also to procure for observation machines for digging, picking, sorting and grading potatoes. Transportation and yield will also be considered. After the noonday banquet of "all-College products," the convention men will gather for the afternoon contests, in which potatoes and potato cutters will display their wares. The experimental field is destined to be the scene of the days' feature.

Susquehanna Reported Strong  
Coach Morgan, former three-letter man at Purdue and head coach of the Susquehanna eleven, has molded a team which is expected to be for better than any of recent years, according to reports from the Selinsgrove campus.

The Susquehanna squad, numbering thirty-one players, will make the trip by bus, arriving in time for a brief practice drill this afternoon.

Visitor's Line-up  
Strengthened by a trio of veterans of three years standing, the Susquehanna eleven presents a formidable

front. Captain Means, husky tackle, Patsy Gimmie, left end, and Groce, right half-back form the nucleus around which the team has been constructed.

Four freshmen are numbered among the varsity linemen. Brunozzi and Moser, 170-pound guards, and Wall, center, make up a yearling pivot trio. Nicodemus, running mate of Captain Means at tackle, weighs a hundred and ninety pounds and is a dangerous defensive player.

Playing opposite the diminutive Gimmie at a wing post is Eastwood, who towers six feet two inches above the soil and tips the beam at one hundred and eighty-seven.

Coach Morgan has a pony back-field averaging one hundred and fifty-seven pounds. Swyers, quarterback,

Dodd, left half, and Ulrich, fullback, are yearlings who have battled their way to varsity recognition. The veteran Groce completes the quartet.
