## Co-eds Traverse More Than Four Thousand Miles

Between the opening of College in September and the Thanksgiving vacation Penn State co-eds hiked a total of 4,092 miles at an average speed of four miles an hour. In spite of rain overhead and mud underfoot forty-one girls hiked at least seventy miles the distance required to win the three and a third points given for a complete hiking season, and many covered a greater mileage.

The second hiking season will close at the Easter vacation and the third when college closes in June. Girls who have hiked seventy miles each season will receive ten points toward their numerals. Major Jennette Bates '29 predicts that many girls will complete the 210 miles if present interest in the activity continues.


