**TRUSTEES PLAN BUDGET AT HARRISBURG MEETING**

Governor-elect Fisher, Ex-officio Member, and President Hetzel Attend

At the annual mid-winter meeting of the board of trustees of Penn State held at the capitol yesterday afternoon routine business affairs of the institution were taken up. Chief interest was in the legislative budget of the college for the next two years.

Governor-elect John S. Fisher, for several years a member of the board by election of the agricultural and industrial societies of the State, though extremely busy with pre-inaugural affairs, was expected to attend the meeting late this afternoon. Following his inauguration as governor tomorrow he becomes an ex-officio member of the board of college trustees.

President Ralph D. Hetzel attended his first meeting of the board today as the administrative head of the college, taking up his office as secretary of the board. He will remain in Harrisburg for the State Farm Products Show, and will give his first public address as president of the college at the convocation opening the big agricultural event tonight.
