### Boxers Garner Three Titles To Win Crown

even the incentive of the stake could not keep Ricketts from losing. The M. I. T. man showed that his performance against Wolff—it was Wolff's hardest bout of the year—was anything but a flash. He blasted Ricketts about the ring and at the end of three rounds Penn State was the victor.

The bell was the signal for bedlam. Everyone jumped into the ring until not one more could cram in it. The crowd, entirely in sympathy with the uphill battle of the Nittany battlers, cheered the Penn State team as if it were its own. Incidentally, Flynn was carried from the ring on the shoulders of his admirers.

But most of all it was the unexpected victories of Steve Bendick and Steve Hamas that thrilled the crowd. Allie Wolff had been expected to win, his defeats of Flynn and Ricketts had assured him his eleventh win of the season and of a championship. But Bendick and Hamas were unknown before the tournament started.

Bendick registered the first upset by hammering Clark of Penn into submission to gain the finals and Hamas accounted for the second by disposing of the hitherto undefeated "Dynamite" Livoti, a burly Syracuse heavyweight. Bendick then did a good job of winning the championship and Hamas followed his lead.

Matched against Coleman, picked as the certain winner of the crown, Bendick spotted the Navy man twenty-five pounds and defeated him handily. Bendick dropped Coleman twice, once in each of the first two rounds and each time for a count of six.

Steve Hamas, with only three days training, and a last minute substitute at that, completed the night by out-boxing Lewis of Penn in three rounds. Hamas' showing was remarkable. His good condition attested itself in his fight with such a slugger as Livoti on Friday and proved itself again in his struggle with Lewis for the championship. He had the Red and Blue man lunging wildly.

The defeats suffered by Mahon and Filegar were heartbreaks, though both men got second places. Mahon won from Peacefield of M. I. T. but lost by a narrow margin to Captain Collins of Navy. Collins later beat Captain Melamed of Syracuse for the championship. This decision and the one which decided the Levy-Wein-

traub bout in the Middies' favor were the most unpopular of the meet and were jeered at by Syracuse newspapers.

Filegar after outpointing Olson of Navy lost to Cordasco in a stirring battle which went an extra round before the decision went to the Orange veteran. Kolkoski lost out to Levy of Penn in another four round exhibition and was deprived by the draw for second or third place. Grazier, although defeated by champion Garin, came back to win a third place against Squires, Orange welter.

It was decided after the tournament to stage next year's meet in the University of Pennsylvania's Palestra. A rule was passed prohibiting a boxer from fighting more than one weight. The fact makes Wolff's eleven triumphs a record which none may equal. A summary of the meet discloses that Penn State's 1927 champions

scored three first places, two second and one third. Navy was second with three individual titles, one runner-up and two thirds. Pennsylvania finished in third place with seven points and Syracuse and M. I. T. tied for fourth position with six points each.

The championship tournament at the Palestra next year will in all probability determine the permanent ownership of the boxing cup. Both Penn State and Navy who have two

legs on the trophy will have practically the same teams that finished one-two this year. The addition of Virginia university to the association will, however, furnish more exacting competition.

Among the Penn State rooters were Coach Spiedel, Conover and Jeffries and Graduate Manager Neil Fleming. Alumni gave a dinner for the Nittany warriors after the meet was over Saturday night.

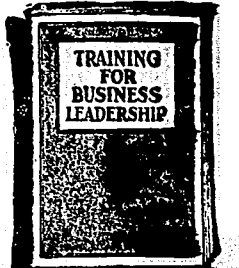
