

Collegiate Crown and Six Wins Mark Boxing Season

Whatever records the 1927 boxing team may have produced it proved one thing conclusively: that to be successful a Penn State ring team must either beat the Navy or win the Intercollegiate. The 1927 team won the Intercollegiate.

An analysis of the past season shows that the Nittany Lions won six dual meets, lost one and captured the Intercollegiate boxing title placing three men as champions. Although the defeat was by Navy the Lions gained more than revenge when they managed to snatch the championship cup out of Navy's hands by a score of 22-21 at Syracuse on March twenty-sixth.

Lions Win Thirty Bouts
A review of the Intercollegiate is a review of the boxing year. The tournament this year reflected the thrills and upsets that have crowded dual meets every week. Individually the Penn State boxers won thirty fights and lost nineteen.

Perhaps the biggest sensations of the season were Allie Wolff's record of eleven straight triumphs and Steve Hamas's victory in the finals of the heavyweight championship. Hamas had not fought in a dual meet all season. Bendick's easy conquest of Coleman, "crack" Navy light-heavyweight, to give him the belt in that division, was another unlooked-for event.

Wolff, Bendick and Hamas are all sophomores.

Although Coach Houck had two veterans in Captain Grazier and Filegar, the lightweight was injured early in the year and did not get into action until the Navy meet. The Lions opened the season by conquering Temple university, 4-3 on February fifth. The following week V. M. L.'s touted aggregation fell to the resin defeated by a 5-2 count.

The score of 5-2 seems to have been the Lion fetish this year. Five of the Penn State bouts ended in that score. Navy succeeded in winning by that count, several tough breaks against Mahon and Filegar proving too huge an obstacle. It was the only time that the Lions lost.

A winning streak started on February twenty-sixth that culminated in the Blue and White's second championship. Pennsylvania was the first victim, falling by a 5-2 count while Syracuse, despite a hard fight, lost 4-3. Victories over N. Y. U. and Notre Dame, both by 5-2 scores ended the dual meet season.

Wolff, Kolkoski, Bendick and Grazier had the best individual records. Wolff stretched his streak to eleven in the Intercollegiate. During the year he conquered Pat Canny, giving the Notre Dame captain his only defeat in three years. Frequently during the season Wolff, Grazier and Bendick fought above their regular weights. Grazier was successful in five out of seven bouts while Bendick won three out of four. Kolkoski piled up six triumphs, losing a close bout to Weintraub of Navy who won the championship against Levy.

Off to a slow start, Filegar met with unlooked for breaks but gave a good account of himself and finished his second year undefeated in the home ring. Mahon, although winning but a single bout, showed much promise, and wound up second in the tournament. Mahoney's early season work was better than his later exhibitions. Several times during the year Bevan, Boruch, Harrington and Wilford represented the Blue and White.

With everyone but Grazier returning, Penn State should repeat its successes next year.

In recognition of their season's records, the members of the team and Coach Houck were guests of honor at a banquet held at the Theta Kappa Phi house Thursday evening.

be distributed through booths stationed in Old Main hall. The bids will be distributed on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, which days will be a period of silence. This period of silence, as regards any freshman, will terminate when a freshman has presented himself at the house of his choice, i. e. Wednesday night at six P. M. after the closing of rushing season.

D. No freshman shall be permitted to room in the house nor stay over night in the house of a fraternity that is a member of this council until after he has been pledged to that fraternity.

E. No member of a fraternity that

is a member of this council shall entertain a freshman after eleven p. m. F. It shall be considered an infraction of interfraternity courtesy for any fraternity to call upon a freshman while he is a guest at another fraternity.

G. During the rushing period, no fraternity that is a member of this council shall entertain at breakfast.

H. The rushing period shall not be considered officially closed until seven p. m. of the first Sunday after the opening day of rushing season. After that time the "open season" may be resorted to.
