

FINAL EXAMINATION SCHEDULE

All recitations and practicums for the second semester will end Saturday, June 1, 1927, at noon. There will be no scheduled examinations for seniors graduating in June. Examinations for other students will take place from June 6 to June 10 inclusive.

Any student having two examinations scheduled at the same time, or any student having three examinations scheduled on the same day, is required to report the fact in person at the Registrar's Office on the special form provided there. To receive adjustment such conflicts MUST be reported not later than five o'clock on Wednesday, April 27.

Notices of adjustment will be mailed to heads of departments and be ready for distribution to students at the Registrar's Office on May 9. Appointment examinations should not be arranged until after notices of adjustment have been sent out. The dates of these examinations will be announced during the week of May 16 by the instructors concerned.

Examinations will be of two hours' duration, beginning at eight and at ten-thirty a. m. and at two p. m.
