Propose Amendments To A. A. Constitution

(Continued from page two) Because neither the faculty nor the student body have a direct representation on the governing committee, both of these elements have been more or less in ignorance of how or why decisions are made and carried into effect. This has given rise to misunderstandings, and perhaps has been the origin of rumors and gossip which have been prejudicial to harmony. The committee has been in several conferences with a special committee of the College Senate and with a special committee of the Student Council. The viewpoints of both the faculty and student body were found to be very far from strongly desirous of obtaining some such reorganization of the Alumni Advisory Committee, as would accomplish better understanding on all sides and, especially, afford them intimate touch with what they regard as a matter in which they have a vital interest.

(a) BOARD OF ATHLETIC CONTROL. After consideration of the various aspects of the present situation and an effort to secure all possible future exigencies, the committee, with the concurrence of the special faculty committee, the Alumni Advisory Committee and the special Student Council committee, respectfully recommends that the present Alumni Advisory Committee be abolished and in its stead a body to be known as the Board of Athletic Control, be created, such a body to be made up of the following representation:

One member from the Board of Trustees of the College, who shall be alumnus; four members of the College Senate, five members from the Alumni Association and three students.

Alumni President Mitchell's committee does not feel that it would be either advisable or proper to attempt to restrict the faculty or the student body in the respective selection of representatives on the proposed board, but it is of the opinion that no coach employed at this institution should be a member of it.

Such a Board would be self-contained in that the faculty group would in itself constitute the College Senate Committee on Athletics, which functions with respect to eligibility, approval of schedules, etc. It would be a clearing house for the numerous and successful conduct of athletic activities because of the suggested composition of the Board it should function with greater frequency, be more flexible and be better informed on all matters of interest and responsibility.

The accomplishment of such a reorganization would necessitate a revision of the constitution of both the Alumni Association and the College Athletic Association. The necessary revision of the latter constitution has been assured the committee by the student representatives. Such proposed revision of the latter constitution would provide that the revision does not require approval of both the Senate and Alumni Association, and with such limitation of amendment of the Athletic Association, constituting the representatives of the Student Council have expressed themselves to be in accord.

(b) ELIMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIPS. During the survey the subject of so-called Athletic Scholarships impressed itself upon the committee as a real contributing cause to present unrest in athletic relations. The committee has been informed that in many institutions financial assistance is given to athletes, in some cases openly, in others under a guise or another. But the committee has become convinced that the present general system of athletic scholarships and financial help to athletes, in some in many colleges, is neither a credit to, nor in the best interests of, the institutions, or of good sportsmanship, as it exists at Penn State.

But it is believed that such scholarships have not resulted in real benefit to the institutions, because many holders of them have withdrawn from college before graduation and awards of such scholarships have tended to discourage the athletic development of students who do not hold such scholarships. The committee, therefore, recommends that no athletic scholarships be awarded to any student entering Penn State in the future.

(c) SEPARATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION FROM THE COACHING OF INTERCOLLEGIATE TEAMS. Due to the inadequacy of equipment, the development of intramural sports has been retarded. It is believed, however, that in the future a great and useful department of physical education will be built up, wherein the physical development of the student at Penn State shall keep pace with the mental development. With this in view, the committee recommends that, as soon as it becomes possible, there shall be a separation of the Department of Physical Education of the College, and the activities which the proposed Board of Athletic Control may be delegated to supervise, to the end that the Department of Physical Education will function solely as do the other schools of the College, and that its director shall not be a coach of any branch of sport or any team taking part in intercollegiate competition.

In conclusion, the committee states that the comments, conclusions and recommendations made represent its unanimous thought arrived at after the most careful consideration it was able to give to the situation as found.
