BOUCKE DESCRIBES BUSINESS SUCCESS

Penn State Economist Speaks On Several Factors in World of Trade

EMPHASIZES SYMPATHY AS PRINCIPLE REQUISITE

"Many other factors depend on success in the world of business besides book knowledge and learning," was the opinion of Dr. O. F. Boucke, head of the economics department, in his address to Pi Lambda Sigma, honorary pre-legal fraternity, in Room 16 Liberal Arts Wednesday night.

"Sympathy is one of the foremost things in the business world," continued Doctor Boucke. "One must feel with a man, instead of for him, and should put himself in the other's place for once." The Penn State economist described Abraham Lincoln as a rare example of sympathy personified. He declared further that to gain the fellowship of his associates, man must learn to be sympathetic toward men and to adapt himself to them.

Stresses Dependability
Doctor Boucke cited dependability as another requirement to success. Stressing the importance of this quality, he declared "We must learn to depend on persons and things. Under dependability, there comes thoroughness, neatness and economy. Thoroughness implies sufficiency of structure, cleanliness and non-bound logic or reason."

In concluding, Doctor Boucke stated that man's habits of yesterday are the soil in which the future success is planted. A job can be made big was
