Bucknell Confers Degree on Hetzel

President R. D. Hetzel received the degree of Doctor of Laws from Bucknell university on Wechesday maning at the annual commencement, at that institution. The degree was conferred by President E. W. Hunt, of Bucknell university, upon authoray of the faculty and board of the university.

The invitation to receive fins degree was extended to President Hetzel last December before he took up his duties at Penn State. It was extended as a desire on the part of Bucknell to mark Doctor, Hetzel's coming to Pennsylvania, and is especially appreciated by Penn State people as a highly courteous act, on the part of one of Penn States nearest an expensive president of the University of New Hampshire, Doctor Hetzel received the degree of Doctor of Laws from Dartmouth college in 1918, conferred by President E. M. Hopkins, and from the University of Maine, in 1924 from President C. C. Little, who soon afterwards became president of the University of Michigan.
