duct tomorrow night's assembly at which a comprehensive outline of the "Y" activities will be presented. Monday night the freshmen will have explained to them the function, responsibility and working of student government at Penn State. Tuesday night an athletic mass meeting will take place.

#### Addresses by Deans

Short talks by the Deans of the several schools will take place at tomorrow's assembly. Through these talks the freshmen will gain a general knowledge of the scope of the individual schools. In addition to these short talks, lectures will be given at meetings of each of the schools. The deans and department heads will explain the nature of the work and the field of each of the courses offered. At the same time the freshmen will be informed of the school rules and procedures. Judge H. W. Mitchell, president of the Board of Trustees, is expected to speak at this assembly.

General Lectures During Freshman Week lectures will be given on student health, military courses, student conduct, physical training and sports. Sometime in October two more lectures will be given to the newcomers on the history of the College and the College and its relations to the public. As part of the Freshman Week program, intensive instruction will be given to each of the twenty-one sections on "How to Study" and on student traditions and honor.

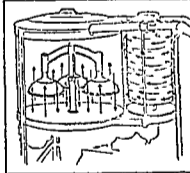
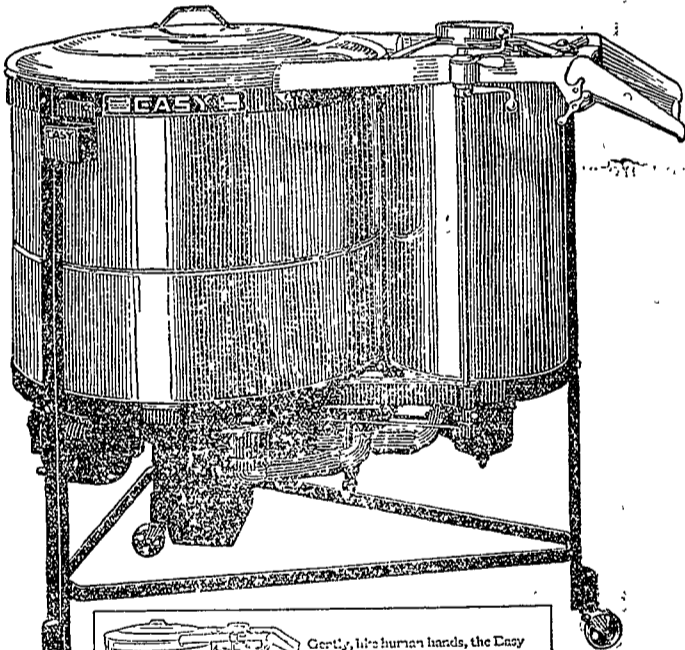

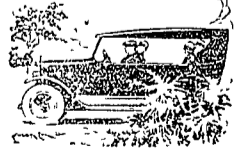
