**Prominent Researcher
Receives Vice-Deanship
Of Chemistry School**

Important changes and promotions in the administrative staff of the School of Chemistry and Physics were announced yesterday by President Ralph D. Hetzel.

Dr. W. P. Davey, internationally known for his physical chemistry research work at the General Electric Company, who came to Penn State a year ago as professor of physical chemistry, has been appointed vice-dean of the school, assisting Dean G. L. Wendt. Doctor Davey will also serve as chairman of the faculty of the School of Chemistry and Physics.

Dr. Ries Is Director

Dr. E. D. Ries, well known for his oil research work and experiments with gasoline substitutes, has been

appointed director of the Division of Industrial Research of the College, and promoted to the rank of professor of chemical engineering. He came to Penn State a year ago from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. In the industrial research division here he will have supervision of work now being conducted on a dozen major research problems which eventually are expected to have of great value to the state and nation.
