**Players Inconsistent**  
During the scrimmage seasons of the last few days, some reminder of last season has been always apparent. This time the four teams which are practicing daily are playing inconsistent football—the type that marked many of the performances of Coach Berdek's eleven last year.

One day the gridmen show promise with the backfields working smoothly and the lines charging in powerful sweeps and maneuvering great gaps for them. Another day the forward wall has no punch, the ends are erratic, the backfield slow and uncertain with a null and void sense of pigskin strategy.

**No Permanent Line-up**  
Inability to secure a permanent line-up because of re-examination may be one of the causes for the inefficient playing. Substitutes have been frequenting the berths of Krall, Green-shields, Roepke and other veterans.

With such disconcerting conditions arising, the football men progressed too slowly for Berdek, spent an uneventful four-day period of training.

Pincura and Roepke have adapted themselves quickly to the new style of play, while Steve Hamas, Joe Miller and Chet Ridgeway have been slowed up considerably because the trick plays are not surely fixed in their minds.

**McAndrews, The Man-hawk**  
Throughout the afternoon scrimmaging there still looms the substitute threat. Marty McAndrews, alternating at centre and tackle on the second team, but playing his best game at the tackle post, is proving to be a veritable man-hawk. The Lion pugilist has developed into a sure tackler who never loses sight of the ball-carrier and who often brings down his man on the opposite end of the line.

Allie Wolfe was nuzzing a strategic sack Saturday afternoon, cleverly reversing field for five and ten-yard gains. Captain Roepke remained his consistent self throughout in running the ball around the ends and off-tackle and in passing the leather oval with accuracy.

**Slamp Is Fast**  
Barney Slamp has caught Bozdek's spirit of speed and is plucking the ball from the air in mid-season style. Wilson and Hewitt both found themselves on Saturday, advancing the ball for long gains on short buck and end run plays.

**Punters Are Scarce**  
The punting problem remains unsolved. Neither Roepke nor Ridgeway, Nittany booters, are kicking in a manner that will transform King Bezek into a benevolent despot. Delp has shown little power. Only Hewitt, whose short field goal tallied Saturday against a listless variety, lacking some of its veterans, has shown ability in this line.
