60,000 Attend Battle  
 More than sixty thousand football customers witnessed the crucial test for Pitt and saw Penn State's defense torn to shreds as Booth, Hagen and Welch battered their way for touchdowns. Unable to solve the Pitt aerial attack and themselves unable to complete successful forwards, the Lion legion was soon thrown into chaos. Only one pass made a safe landing for Penn State while Pitt completed ten. Two first downs were recorded for the Berzeksians.

Roepke, Penn State's real threat, failed to function properly as a smash-

ing Panther line dispersed the Lion's poorly organized interference. With Wolff and Langen unable to carry the ball to any great extent and neither able to co-operate on the offense, Pitt's task at victory was a comparatively easy one.

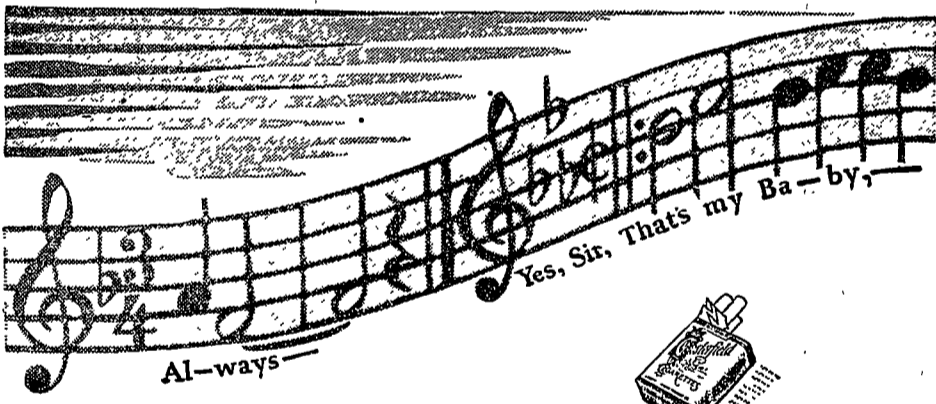
