### Two Plays

There are two plays entitled "Romeo O Romeo!" and "Two Tickets at a Beat," besides some very original short stories and a review of Sidney Lamer, one of America's obscure poets, by William E. Sigmiller '28. Some of the sketches are "Greened Lightning," "The Fish With No Personality," and "Penn State Spirit," the latter a piece of satire.

were never pressed by the feat of impending defeat. However, the Blue and White passers must improve considerably in the next few days if they wish to give the Pitt cagemen a stiff battle in Friday night's tilt in the Smoky City.

George Delp and Lou Reilly led the Nittany offense with sixteen and fourteen points, respectively. Delp scored five of his eight field goals on set shots outside the Plaid defense while Reilly sunk five from the field and four from the foul line. The Lion foul shooting was an improvement over that of former games with seven out of thirteen tries, but their work on free throws still leaves something to be desired.

goal and three fouls against the one free throw scored by the Tartans to regain the lead. Three long shots by Delp and Langren increased the Nittany advantage to 18-10 when the half ended.

In the second period the Penn State quintet showed improvement and added twelve points to its score to make the count 30 to 16 when the Carnegie team called time out.
