enrollment limit for freshman boys and girls by one hundred and seventy. One thousand and twenty boys and one hundred and fifty girls will make up the registration quota, starting with the 1928-1929 academic year. This number of incoming students marks the record for entrants to the College since the period during the War, according to Registrar Hoffman.

The newcomers will be divided proportionately among the six schools. One hundred and fifty freshmen will enter the School of Agriculture, one hundred and twenty the School of Chemistry and Physics, one hundred and fifty the School of Education, four hundred and fifty the School of Engineering, two hundred and fifty the School of Liberal Arts, while fifty of the first-year men will be taken into the School of Mines.

The present limit for new male students is nine hundred while incoming female students are now limited to one hundred.
