Prof. Andrew A. Borland, head of the dairy department, sailed from New York June seventeenth for England where he will attend the eighth International Dairy Congress in London as a delegate representing the United States.

Appointed by President Coolidge Professor Borland was selected by President Coolidge to represent this country in the world-wide dairy conclave. He is recognized far and wide as a leading dairy authority, having been president of the American Dairy Science Association for two years and head of the Penn State department since 1919.
