

CHAPEL SPEAKERS FOR YEAR INCLUDE NOTED EDUCATORS

Dr. W. W. Comfort, of Haverford College, Accepts Invitation To Address Students

RABBI LAZARON, CHAPLAIN SHRUM WILL SPEAK AGAIN

List Also Contains Outstanding Men of Both National, Foreign Repute

Four college presidents are included in the list of Sunday chapel speakers scheduled to address Penn State students this year, according to a statement recently issued from the President's office.

Dr. Henry W. Hanson of Gettysburg college, Dr. W. W. Comfort, of Haverford college, Dr. Mordecai W. Johnson, of Howard university, and Dr. Clarence A. Barbour of Rochester Theological seminary, will address chapel-goers at various times throughout the year. Other speakers having college connections are Dr. Henry H. Tweedy, Yale Divinity school; Dr. Elbert Russel, Duke university; Prof. John H. Frizzell, Penn State; the Rev. Halford E. Lucecock, Yale uni-

versity; and Dr. Harry F. Waid, Union Theological seminary. Rabbi Morris S. Lazaron, of Baltimore, and Chaplain Reuben W. Shrum, of the presidential yacht, "Mayflower," will return this year. Both of these men have provided messages of interest to Penn State audiences in past years.

Warden J. J. Malone of Toynbee Hall of the Universities, located at London, England, will speak here for the first time. The Hon. Franklin S. Edwards, Philadelphia, is also scheduled for an address.

Among the other pastors who will visit Penn State are Dr. W. Warren Giles, of the First Reformed Church, East Orange, N. J., the Rev. Peter K. Emmons, of the First Presbyterian Church, Scanton, and the Rev. Samuel W. Sockman, Madison Avenue M. E. Church, New York City. Three Philadelphia ministers, Dr. Ivan Murray Rose, First Baptist Church, and Dr. Andrew Mutch, Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church, and the Rev. Philip Steinmetz, Rector of the St. Paul's Church, will also give addresses.

Champlin Writes Articles For Educational Journals

Dr. Carroll D. Champlin, of the department of education and psychology, is the author of several articles, dealing with the problem of education here and elsewhere, to be published in the next issues of professional magazines. A description of the educational advantages of our own college is offered in "The Power of Penn State." The more than state-wide influence in many different fields of training offered here is depicted. The quality of the residence instruction and campus opportunities, the invaluable services rendered by the different kinds of research and the moral quality of the student life are all treated. One of the articles, "Training for Teaching," points out the importance of laying a sound foundation for professional preparation and practice. Another, "Using What We Have," emphasizes the need for a superior output of professional literature. "Who is Practical in Education?" reveals the changing tendencies in curriculum administration and classroom procedure. It points out that what is practical for one type of student mind may be impractical for others.
