VISITING AGRICULTURIST LAUDS DR. H. P. ARMSBY

Prof. Lars Fredericksen, Danish Dairy Leader, Praises Work Of Former Ag Director

Tribute was paid to the work of the late Dr. H. P. Armsby, former director of the agricultural experiment station and Institute of Animal Nutrition here, by Lars Fredericksen, professor of dairy husbandry at the Royal Veterinary and Agricultural College, Copenhagen, Denmark, on a visit here this week. While visiting Dr. Ernest B. Forbes, present director of the institute, Professor Erickson stated that experiments at the Royal College showed that the Armsby feeding standard came closer to the Danish standard than any other in the world. He also declared that Dr. Armsby's "Nutrition of Farm Animals" had been of more benefit to Danish dairymen than any other book circulated in Denmark. Dr. Armsby was director of the agricultural experiment station from the time it was founded in 1887 until 1907, when he assumed the directorship of the Institute of Animal Nutrition.

Heat Specialists Hold Conclave Next Month

Plans for the Second Industrial Heating Conference, which is to be held here during the latter part of October, are nearing completion according to Prof. William R. Young of the engineering extension department, who is in charge of the program. Many topics are planned which will be of interest to manufacturers and consumers alike. General information, research and technology will be discussed at each meeting of the conference. Some of the topics will concern the history and development of electrical heating devices, heat resisting alloys, the chemistry of steel making and different types of conveyors and furnaces.
