(Continued from first page) berths Engel will assume his regular duties at center with Gillard and Yablonski on either side of him. This line not only stemmed the tide of the varsity third team but also stopped several plays behind the line of scrimmage.

Lafayette Defeats Seminary Although outplaying their opponents seven first downs to one Coach Parnell's charges lost their first game of the season to the Muhlenburg yearlings 3 to 0. Muhlenburg's margin of victory was gained in the second period by a field goal. Two fumbles, one with the ball on their opponents' 5-yard line and the other while on the 43-yard stripe ruined Lafayette's chances to score.

In their second game the yearlings of the Mason gridiron team marched to a 16 to 0 victory over Hill School. Two touchdowns and a field goal gave the Parnell coached machine a lead which the Potstown lads were unable to overcome.

For the first time since the adoption of the one year ruling at that college the Easton plebes handed the Wyoming Seminary eleven its first defeat of the season, 15 to 0, at Kingston. The Lafayette gridmen completed 10 out of 12 forward passes and employed only straight line bucks to topple their enemy. Sokolow, stocky left halfback, was the outstanding backfield man in the Kingston fray. O'Neil at fullback gained first downs repeatedly through the line while Reuter, center, blocked more plays and made more tackles than any other lineman.

Parnell to Start Regulars The Lafayette yearlings suffered their second defeat of the season 12 to 7 at the hands of the Pennsylvania State Teachers' College gridmen at West Chester. The Eastonians again outplayed their opponents, this time

11 first downs to 7. Several times the venturers of the Maroon were within scoring distance but on each occasion they lacked the final spurt to carry the oval across the goal line.

Coach Parnell will probably start his regular team in tomorrow's fray. O'Neil will assume the duties at fullback, while Sokolow and Worrell will take their posts at halfback. Neff will back signals for the quarter. The Easton contingent will represent a strong forward wall to stem the Nittany attack. Edwaney and Fisher, prominent in the Wyoming encounter, will pair off at guards with Frescoln and Rees on the extremities of the line. Vanderbush and Cook also outstanding in the Seminary struggle, will fill the tackle berths while Reuter will take up his work at center.
