FRENCHMAN ADDRESSES EDUCATION INSTRUCTORS

Speaking on the "International Spirit in French Education" M. Auguste V. Deslois, noted French educator, addressed the faculty of the School of Education at the University Club Wednesday night.

The speaker is Associate Director of the National Office of French Universities and Schools and was a member of the commission that visited the United States last year in behalf of French universities. This was the first of a series of lectures to be presented by the School of Education on education in foreign countries.
