Examination Schedule

First Semester 1928-1929

All recitations and practicals for the first semester will end Saturday, February 2, 1929 at 11:00 a. m. Examinations will take place from February 4 to February 9, inclusive. The designation SEE LIST indicates that the items for examinations will be announced or posted by the instructor of the department concerned.

Any student having two examinations scheduled at the same time or any student having three examinations scheduled on the same day, is required to report the fact in person at the office of the Registrar on the special form provided there. To receive adjustments, such conflicts must be reported not later than noon on Saturday, January 12, 1929.

Notices of adjustment will be available to students at the Office of the Registrar and mailed to the Heads of Departments on January 21, 1929.

Adjustment examinations should not be scheduled until after notices are announced during the week of January 28, by the instructors concerned.

Examinations will be of two hours' duration, beginning at eight and ten, twelve and two P. M.

(Continued from first page) thirty-four years of continuous service to the College. He came to Penn State in 1894 and at the time of his resignation was head of the English department.

Authority on English Professor Pattee is widely known as an authority on American literature. He was one of the five noted literary workers recently chosen by the American Literature Group of the Modern Language Association of America to edit American Literature, a journal of literary history, criticism and bibliography. He is also editor of Creative Reading, another literary journal.

Doctor Pattee has written The House of the Black Ring, The Wine of May and Other Lyrics; Pasquaney, a study; essays, and many other articles, and has edited numerous volumes.
