The State dramatic association was organized here in 1925 by Profs. Cloathing and Mason. In December of that year the group held its first tournament here with seven colleges

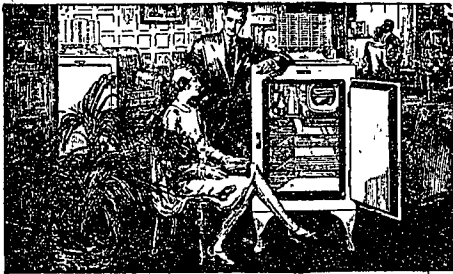
participating. Thirteen colleges now are members of the organization and several more have expressed a desire to join.

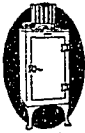
in individual training of students for special work, in the lumber industry, in the wood-using industries, and in city forestry. A study is made of the qualification and natural inclination of individual students, and the efforts of that student are directed for as long before graduation as possible towards fundamental training for future specialization in forest research, or forest soils, range management, forest pathology, forest entomology, or chemists or engineers in forest production. In addition, students coming here from Mont Alto will be able to take courses in the other Schools of the College, especially in Liberal Arts, Chemistry and Physics, and Engineering. The department of forestry is now attached to the School of Agriculture.

"The Pennsylvania State Forest School was established in 1903 to provide technically trained men to handle the State-owned forests. It is located on the Mont Alto State Forest in the South Mountains bordering the Cumberland Valley, near the village of Mont Alto and about 10 miles south of Chambersburg. It is next to the oldest existing forest school in America. Its location on the Mont Alto State Forest affords one of the best out-door laboratories for forestry instruction possessed by any forest school in America. This forest has been under careful management for 20 years. Adjoining the School are 23,000 acres of State-owned forest land and a forest tree nursery with an annual capacity of approximately

4,000,000 trees. There are more than 500 acres of forest tree plantations established by the students. By authority of the State Council of Education this school grants the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Forestry."
