'Small Sum Will Supply Well Balanced Meal,' States School Lunch Director

"Thirty-five cents will buy all the calories needed for a well balanced lunch," stated Miss Phyllis K. Sprague, associate professor of home economics and director of the school lunch service in the Women's building yesterday.
"The price is lower than strictly commercial establishments can afford," she continued, "because labor is furnished by junior and senior home economics girls as a part of their practical work in the school lunch course, and because there are no cent costs involved. We fix the price to include only the cost of materials; and a sufficient margin to cover dish washing, lighting, and heat."
"Most of the girls taking this course enter into work of the same order when they graduate," continued Miss Sprague, "hence, the experience derived from their training is invaluable to them. Through the medium of a school cafeteria they learn how to cope with equipment and management

problems and how to deal with the public."
"School lunch is growing in popularity every year," Miss Sprague declared, "especially with the men. We serve approximately sixty-five people daily in less than fifteen minutes. More than half of these are faculty members. However, there is a constantly increasing number of students who come here for their noon meal."
