Merrick Talks on 'Technical Man' At Open Meeting

'The Technical Man' was the topic of the lectures given by F. A. Merrick, general manager and vice-president of the Westinghouse Electric Company of Pittsburgh and G. S. Chang, director of industrial and public relations for the United States Rubber Company in Schwab auditorium on Friday night.

Mr Merrick was the opening speaker and discussed 'What Changes Are Taking Place in Industry Which Will Ultimately Affect the Demand for Technically Trained Men?' He explained that this is the age of power, and that not only the minor but the major industries are now realizing the need for technically trained men.

'Industry,' he said, 'is becoming more broad in its needs and demands upon men. The present day increase in the number and quality of industries causes the broadening. Therefore technically trained men are demanded in increasing numbers.'

Mr. Merrick implied that this demand for technically trained men in industry must ultimately result in a reconciliation of the viewpoints of industry and education. The demands of industry are now being considered in the making of college curricula.

However, Mr Merrick also believes that industries do respect the views of education. 'The technically trained man is making his greatest contribution to industry by raising our standards of living,' said Mr. Chang who was the

second speaker. 'To make his best contribution to industry, the technically trained man should realize that he is dealing with humans and must first sell himself and then his ideas. We cannot handle people as we handle machines,' concluded Mr. Chang.

The designation SEE LIST indicates that the rooms for examinations will be announced or posted by the instructor or department concerned.

Any student having two examinations scheduled at the same time or three examinations on the same day is required to report the fact in person at the Office of the Registrar on the special form provided there. To receive adjustments, such conflicts must be reported not later than noon on Saturday, May 25, 1929.

Appointment examinations should not be scheduled until after notices of adjustment will be available to students at the Office of the Registrar and mailed to the Heads of Departments on Wednesday, May 29 of adjustment are available. The dates of these examinations will be announced after May 30 by the instructors concerned.
