FRENCH DIRECTOR BOOSTS INSTITUTE

ing his master's degree. For the past three years he has been connected with New York university.
During the World War, Professor Ernst spent two years as interpreter with the American Army in France and Belgium. He worked as a journalist in Paris from 1923 to 1925, returning to this country to assume his post at New York university.
He, in collaboration with Dr. Helene Havitt, is editor of Edmond Estienne's "Tels qu'ils furent." He is also author of numerous articles on literature and French and American politics. He is a contributor to the French Review, Wisconsin Magazine, L'Information, and others.
Largest In Years
Dr. des Granges, the visiting professor, is returning to Penn State for the second time, having lectured with considerable success two years before at the French institute. He has also been visiting lecturer at the French school of Middlebury college.
The guest speaker is a recognized authority on French literature as well as a leader in French education.

His history of French literature is used as a standard textbook in colleges and universities both here and abroad.
This will probably be the largest institute since it started six years ago, state Summer Session authorities. The largest so far was in 1925 when twenty students were enrolled. Last year forty members attended the institute.

CHEMISTRY HEAD ASSUMES DUTIES

These fellowships have been provided from various industrial sources.
One new fellowship is in the department of physics for the investigation of radio reception and the scientific principles governing the design of radio tubes. Another in the department of chemistry is for the study of organic chemical materials, while there are a number of researches un-

der the direction of the new dean. Although Dr. Whitmore was born in North Attleboro, Mass., he spent most of his youth in Williamsport. He started in the public schools there, but later his family moved to Atlantic City, N. J., from which high school he graduated.
He graduated from Harvard in 1911 and in the next year secured his master's degree at that institution. In 1911 he was awarded his doctor's degree for work in organic chemistry.
According to a story told by Dean Henry Gratton Doyle, a close friend and classmate of Dr. Whitmore, the new dean worked his way through college. He served as night telephone operator and the only sleep he secured was over the switch-board.
Wrote Several Books
After securing his doctor's degree, Dr. Whitmore did research work for several years at his alma mater, then became instructor in chemistry at Williams college. Later he served as assistant professor of chemistry at Rice Institute.
For two years he was a faculty member at University of Minnesota, then in 1920 went to Northwestern. He has been head of the chemistry department at the mid-western institution since 1925.
The new head is author of several technical books, including a volume in the American Chemical series. He is also a member of the editorial board of the annual series entitled "Organic Syntheses" and an editor of the Chemical Bulletin.
Dr. Whitmore is a member of the advisory board to Major General H. A. Fries, chief of Chemical Warfare service of the United States Army. He is also chairman of the division of

chemistry and chemical technology of the National Research council.
At present he is a director of the American Chemical society and a fellow in the American association for Advancement of Science. He was the director of the second institute of chemistry held in 1928.
