PRESIDENT MAKES FORESTRY CHANGE

ties offered here at State College for thorough training in the sciences fundamental to proper understanding of the principles underlying the practice of forestry. At the college the student will take subjects basic to the development of technical and business aspects in growing timber crops and forest properties.

For specialization at the College, neophyte foresters in their junior year will enter option groups to which they are best fitted and prepare as professional foresters, or for the lumber industry, wood utilization, or private forestry.

Continue Old Courses

Special training similar to that offered in the past in the Penn State forestry school will include forest research, forest soils, forest entomology, forest pathology, forest economics, and range management. All senior foresters will spend their last two months at Mont Alto for the making of a working plan for a large tract of timber.

The advisory council for the new Pennsylvania State Forest school, appointed by President Hetzel, is composed of Dr. Joseph H. Illick, state forester of Pennsylvania, Col. Henry W. Shoemaker, member of the State Forestry commission, chairman; Dr. James N. Rule, deputy superintendent of the State Department of Public Instruction; Dean Ralph L. Watts, School of Agriculture at the College; Prof. G. A. Retan, State Teachers college at Mansfield, a graduate of the Mont Alto Forestry school, and E. O. Ehrhart, forester of the New York
