

CARTMELL BEGINS X-COUNTRY DRILLS

Mentor Opens Drive for Fourth Consecutive Title—Misses 3 Of 1928 Champions

Coach Nate Cartmell will inaugurate his campaign for a fourth consecutive intercollegiate cross country championship for Penn State when candidates for the varsity and freshman distance squads report at 4 o'clock this afternoon on the New Beaver field track.

In addition to the IC-4A championship over the Van Cortlandt Park course in New York City, the harriers will encounter in dual meets New York university October 19 or 20, at the metropolis, Syracuse here November 9, and Pitt at Pittsburgh November 16.

Coach Cartmell faces a difficult task in retaining the crown, graduation having taken severe toll of last year's titleholders. Most prominent of the casualties was Bill Cox, two-time holder of the championship and twice ejected Lion leader. Bill lost his diadem to Johnny Reid of Harvard, finishing in third place behind Lindsay Richardson of Maine.

Veterans Return

George Offenhauser, seventh-place winner for the past two years, and second of the Nittany pack to cross the finish line last year, also received his degree last June. The third-place Nittany harrier last year, Art Bass, who finished in tenth position, is the third serious loss to the squad.

Of last year's team, the veteran mentor will have Captain Ratcliffe, Chick Meisinger, Dick Detweiler, Paul Rokers, Luke Conroy. While Bob Burton, leading plebe runner last year, is not expected to return, several members of the 193 contingent will offer determined opposition to their upper class rivals.
