

BOOTERS TO MEET IN PRACTICE TILT

Coach Jeffrey Will Hold Trial Game Between Varsity Teams Tomorrow

In the last practice session before the final drive for the opening game of the soccer season with Haverford next Saturday, Coach Bill Jeffrey will send his "probable" team against his "possible" team tomorrow afternoon at 1:30 o'clock on the golf links playing field.

For several weeks the State booters have been working hard to develop a team capable of upholding the brilliant record of Lion teams in the past. With a nucleus of nine letter men from last season Jeffrey should put another strong eleven on the field this year.

No definite varsity line-up has been decided upon and several players are fighting for each position. Tomorrow's practice game should go a long way towards settling the team that will meet Haverford in the opening league game.

On the "probable" team Gerson will play goalie. Hutchinson and Henzey, experienced backs, will take care of the two fullback jobs. Captain McLenen, Edpreton, and Frank Stimlin will start at the three halfback positions. Stimlin was a member of the championship 1927 team but did not return to school last year.

The "probable" forward wall will be composed of Lutz, outside right, Fravers, inside right, Skinnell, center, Grammer, inside left, and Anderson outside left.

"Ted" McKune, freshman goalie last year, will play in that position of the "possibles." Harney and Allen, both experienced men will start the game as fullbacks.

Hinkle or Hartzler, at right half, Gupp or Vyverberg at center half, and Shaw or Clare at left half, will insure the "possible" team of being well fortified for the halfback berths. Fatzler, Vyverberg and Clare are from last season's freshman outfit.

Messleman, a sub from last year's squad will probably be seen at inside left. Messleman has been showing steady improvement during the past week. His teammate on the left side of the forward line will be either Shepherd or Young.

Three sophomores, DeBouis at center, Tyson, outside right, and Masters, inside right, complete the strong "possible" team.
